During August there is space on the back page of the notice sheet to use for things other than routine diary dates &c. One possibility is highlights from next Sunday's readings such as these. Comments and suggestions very welcome.

1 Kings 19.4-8 Elijah receives provisions that enable him to go "in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights." What is given is sufficient and strengthening, foreshadowing Jesus as the Bread of Life in the Gospel reading.

Ephesians 4.25-5.2 Some Christians take a sentimental approach to anger and think it is always wrong. The writer surprises us here by recognising that anger has its place, within limits.

John 6.35,41-51 Until this point in Chapter 6, it is "the crowd" which has been engaging with Jesus. Now the crowd is identified as "the Jews". John's Gospel sees "the Jews" as Jesus' primary opponents so a sense of conflict is created.
