Next Sunday, Twelfth Sunday after Trinity (Proper 16)

Joshua 24.1-2a,14-18 (reader: Barbara Purvis); Psalm 34.15-20; Ephesians 6.10-20 (reader: Jenny Black); John 6.56-69 (Gospeller: Opal Walsh); Intercessor: Judy Fletcher

Joshua 24.1-2a,14-18 "Serve God" becomes the core refrain of Joshua's message. However, Joshua presents this as a genuine choice, not something the Israelites are compelled to do. They affirm that they will never forsake the Lord and serve other gods. But they are not merely imitating their leader, because they have their own reasons.

Ephesians 6.10-20 The Church's task is proclamation not just of the gospel but of the mystery of the gospel. We hear first a rationale for the task ("to stand against the wiles of the devil"), secondly, the needed armour (truth, righteousness, peace, faith), and finally, the requisite spiritual orientation (prayer in the Spirit).

John 6.56-69 Jesus wants the hearers to believe (= the Greek word pisteuo/πιστευο which occurs 98 times in this Gospel). How will they (and we) respond? Peter answers for the disciples but does not say *Yes* or *No*. Recognising Jesus for who he is requires both belief and knowledge. One without the other is useless, if not sinister, as Judas will soon demonstrate.
