

Increasing use of the Community Hall

Requests to use our Hall by groups displaced from the Community Centre will mean the Hall being used on three mornings each week from September:

- On Monday mornings: Sure Start "Stay and play" parent and toddler group
- Wednesday and Thursday mornings: Lunch and activity club for older people

It is expected that these groups will use the Hall until the Community Centre becomes available again, at which time we would expect them to consult the PCC about returning to the Community Centre.

The increased use of the Hall has several benefits:

- Providing hospitality for valuable community activities;
- Bringing St Chad's to the attention of many more people from the local community;
- Greatly strengthening the case being made in grant applications for Hall improvements;
- Bringing in much needed funds about £2,000 in this calendar year.
